Regional Officer Report:

- No Strings Stockton
 - o Still going strong, although numbers are expected to drop off now the season is coming to a close. The Sports centre has launched a second session to take place on Thursdays 6pm – 8pm. Katie Zissler is the coordinator of this project, and she will be part funded through her Level 2 in return for running this session voluntarily.
- BJHA Familiarisation course is scheduled to run in Stockton on Tuesday 26th April 2011, after a long time in the pipeline.
- Premier League for Sport School Demonstration took place at Northfields run by Peter Higman. This demonstration saw near 400 children in attendance and had a great atmosphere. 1. Badminton Kick Start
